Using Up 'Leftovers'

Pat Laing has been busy using up leftover wool to make a cat blanket and she suggests two Twitter hashtags for sharing unwanted materials and for recycling.



"This picture shows a cat blanket I made using pieces of wool. I hate throwing out larger bits but over time they build up and are a nuisance.

Usually I will cut things like this up and put in my 'fillings' bag which will then be used for stuffing. But, in my experience, cats are not too fussy about the colours in their beds. They are about every other thing but, as they have not such good sense of colour, they don't care too much as long as it is comfortable. I crocheted the blanket using treble for speed. This could also be a good way to use up thrums, the bane of a weavers life.

Cat and dog charities are always looking for bedding if you have no pets to give them to and you can feel good about your green conscience as well as your charitable endeavour.

There is a Twitter hashtag for sharing unwanted materials which is #doesanyonewant. People post items they want to pass on and other people put up requests for anything they need.


Dutch Spotted Fleece
