September Meeting

This month's meeting is on Saturday 17th September in Craiglockhart Church Halls. Both the Centenary Room and the Large Hall have been booked. Jan Beadle will be running a Weaving Workshop on double weave and the new Spinning Interest Group will be meeting at around 1pm.

Last Month's Meeting

Everyone had a very productive meeting last month and the spinning, weaving and dyeing interest groups were started. Jane Howorth has summarised what was agreed -

The interest groups for spinning, weaving and dyeing met for the first time during the August meeting. It was agreed that these groups will continue meeting in turn during regular guild meetings, one per month, on a rolling programme. We agreed a start time of around 1.00pm. We might need to adjust this to 'lunchtime' if members are involved in day-long workshops, so that everyone who wants to, has the opportunity to meet.

The first three meetings will be: September - spinning; October - weaving; November - dyeing. We can review meeting frequency after this.

The study areas agreed by each group are initially quite broad, and can be interpreted however wished. This is what was agreed by each group:

Spinning

Practice long draw spinning, experimenting to find the most suitable fibre and preparation method. Explore online resources (eg Longdraw James on YouTube)

Bring to next spinning meeting: Any samples you have made, recommendations for favourite books (or bring the books for others to look at) and other resource recommendations. The Online Guild was mentioned as a great resource during this meeting.

Weaving

Members of this group agreed to try something that was new for them. This subject is deliberately very broad so as to include all members, regardless of the type of loom they have. The subject can be interpreted however is wanted. The group also agreed to bring to the meeting any unwanted yarn to redistribute within the group. Members also agreed to make resource recommendations next time.

Dyeing

Members of the dyeing group agreed to experiment with any types of plant dyes that they had access to, and to bring their samples the next time the dyeing group met. There was also discussion around the possibility of organising a future dyeing visit to a member's house.

Alpaca Farm Day

Five members had a great day at the BobCat Alpaca Farm Day in aid of Marie Curie earlier this month. After a rather damp start the sun came out and we had lots of visitors with plenty of people wanting to have a go at spinning the alpaca fibre which the farm had given us. Over £4000 was raised on the day for the Marie Curie charity so it was a very successful event.



Dumfries and Galloway Guild Gathering

Sue McNiven of Dumfries Guild has sent a poster advertising their Guild Gathering on Sunday 9th October at Lincluden Community Centre, Dumfries DG2 0DL. They will be having demonstrations on Preparation techniques, Felting, Dorset Buttons, Spindle spinning and there will be stalls selling all sorts of goodies, home made buttons, pottery fibres and fleeces.

You can learn how to make your own wrist distaff using some hand-spun and commercial yarns, together with beads. Then master the technique of dressing the distaff. Handspinning, weaving and dyeing

24 Hank of Shetland yarn, 2 ply extra fine hank of Shetland yarn for lace knitting. Hand spun from Shetland sheep. Include a sample of fleece staple.

25 Three hanks of hand spun yarn using different natural fibres and dyes inspired by the theme, mounted on card and identifying plant sources.

- 26 Hank of fancy yarn (I.e. slub, loop or spiral). Specify intended use and small worked sample.
- 27 An article in home spun yarn, knitted, crocheted or woven.
- 28 A belt in any hand weaving technique.
- 29 A shopping bag, any hand weaving technique.

There were not many entries in the classes this year so please do think about entering at least one class next year. You will have plenty of time before June 2023. It's a great opportunity to showcase the crafts of spinning, weaving and dyeing.

For Sale

Pat Laing is selling some weaving and dyeing equipment. If you are interested you can contact Pat on 07881 380134.

I am selling some of my stash. The first picture shows dyeing materials. It is going for ± 12 . The two mordants are feroxide sulphate and alum, there are a number of natural dye stuffs and the Dyers Companion which is a boon for any serious dyers out there.

The second is a tapestry loom $16" \times 27"$ along with a beater with metal teeth, 2 shuttles and a reel of cotton 12/6. The price for that is £30.





I have also decided to sell my 4 shaft and an inkle loom. The inkle loom has a beater for adjustment and is very solidly made. I am selling it for £30. The four shaft table loom is an Ashford and has a couple of stick shuttles with it. I am selling that for £300.
