# July visit to At Birkhill House

If you'd like to come to At Birkhill House for two workshops on 19<sup>th</sup> July, please email edinburghguildwsd@gmail.com. The plan is as follows:

Birkhill have proposed a two part workshop for a maximum of 25 participants, with a minimum of 15. The visit would run from 10:30 - 2:30pm, on Saturday 19th July, with workshops in the morning (10:30 - 13:30), and time for a tour of the facilities, meeting the animals, and packed lunch until 2:30pm.

Workshops from 10:30 - 13:30; lunch (bring a packed one!) and visiting the animals and facilities until 2:30.

Workshop 1 - eco-print a 4 x 28 inch piece of merino fabric

<u>Workshop 2</u> - set up solar dye jar with two embroidery thread skeins (one BFL/silk and one silk). The embroidery thread can be used to later stitch into the eco-printed fabric - or for a different project altogether.

The cost per person will be around £20. Birkhill House is on Borders Buses route 51, with around a 5-10 minute walk from the bus stop. Car-sharing may be possible! Let us know if you need or can offer a lift.
